
We, the members of the Class of 1956, who are about to leave the beloved corridors of our school to take our places among others in the world, cannot help but think of the students who have preceded us.


Mike was a happy boy and his pleasing manner made those with whom he associated happy, too.

Pat and Tom then began dancing and were followed by last year's king and queen and the candidates.

After the Crowning, the couples began to leave. Our memories of this dance will never be forgotten.
