
Principal's Message

Class History

Ahoy, maties. THE GOOD SHIP CLASS OF '61 will be entering port on June 23rd - her journey over. The voyage, though bumpy in spots, was a successful one. The crew labored diligently towards the common goal of docking on schedule.

The S.S. '61 shoved off September 9, 1959 amidst a flurry of good wishes from "land-lubbers" and seasoned veterans. When we were three days out to sea, Mr. Zagorsky, the Admiral, called the crew together in the ship's theatre to tell them what was expected of them. They found that there were plenty of opportunities for both work and play, and they also found out later that the two went hand in hand. He told them to take advantage of every opportunity, and with that, The Class of '61 was officially launched.

The first problem confronting the crew was the election of officers. Not being on a senior ship, they could not elect a captain this year. However, they could elect five officers to join in the meetings with the senior officers officers who were under the command of Commander Harvey Shane. After a hard fought battle, the five officers elected were: Eileen Curry, Linda Kelley, Angelo Pandolfo, William Reinhardt, and Robert Sarringer. These were the people to guide the ship on the first year of its long journey.

After working industriously for two months, the crew was rewarded for its efforts. The reward came in the form of the annual ship's dance called the "HARVEST HOP" - sponsored by the Drama and the Science Clubs. A local band supplied the music, and prizes were given to the best hornpipers. Re-freshments were served in the ship's galley and everyone enjoyed himself tremendously.

Thanksgiving time soon rolled around, and with it came a movie sponsored by the English Department entitled "KIDNAPPED." Next, the ship's bulletin, "THE JUNIOR MUSKETEER," was published, and from then on the crew was kept up to date on local happenings.

Just before Christmas, a Christmas concert was held, under the direction of Musicians First Class Sleeper and Parker. A few days later, awards were given to those who sold boosters for the ship's log - "THE MUSKETEER." Presentations of awards were made by advisor, also Yeoman First Class Anthony Burriesci.

The semi-annual report was sent in at the end of January, and as a reward to the crew, another ship's dance was held. The "FEBRUARY FROLIC" proved to be a success. The seas were calm during the month of March, with the exception of the period prior to the time the quarterly reports were sent in. The officers again wanted the crew to relax as they sponsored the "BUNNY HOP."

On Friday, May 13, 1960, the superstitious Drama Club, under the direction of Officer Richard Kenney, presented a drama to suit the occasion. It was "GHOST WANTED," and it supplied the audience with plenty of ghosts and goblins.

The next several weeks were filled with preparations for the final inspection in June. Just before this inspection, the senior ship held its docking or "GRADUATION DANCE." The Class of '61 was invited to attend. On the day that the ship docked, June 24th, reports were handed out. The crew was given liberty for the summer, and they spent the time relaxing while awaiting new sailing orders.

On September 7th, 1960 sailing orders were received by the crew of the S.S. '61. The going this year would be just as hard, but now we were "Old salts." Once again officers would have to be elected. Now being the senior ship, the crew was allowed to elect its own captain. The officers elected were Eva Bullerwell, Rochelle Caroll, Dolores Diaz, Pat Durso, Steve Kelly, Carol Morello, and Ruth Schmierer. In command as senior officer would be Janis McKee.

In October, the crew was allowed relaxation by voluntarily attending the annual "HARVEST HOP." Soon atter this, the "JUNIOR MUSKETEER" published by Printers 1/C Amster and Fetrow. This was an eventful month as the ship's crew polled themselves to see whom they favored for the Presidency. Richard Nixon won by a slight margin, but the crew was not in keeping with popular opinion, and John F. Kennedy was elected to be the President of the United States.

During the voyage the crew was mustered on many occasions and under the sponsorship of Recreational Specialist Edward Haracz, the SCIENCE FAIR and various assembly programs were presented. One of them was the "AN-NUAL CHRISTMAS CONCERT" under the direction of Musicians 1/C Richard Sleeper and Robert Hennessey.

On January 27, and 28, Gilbert and Sullivan's operetta, H.M.S. PINAFORE was presented in the ship's theater. It was an overwhelming success. Officers Hennessey, Kenney and Sleeper were on deck for this.

On May 17th, an attempt was made to discover the talented members of the crew. This was presented in the form of a radio program with commercials and all. Talent was found in abundance. This "TALENT CALVACADE" was sponsored by program directors Sleeper, Burriesci, and Hennessey.

Preparations were in order for the end of the voyage. All had to be in shipshape before the final inspection in June. The "GRADUATION DANCE" was held and the Class of '62 was invited. The final form of recreation for the voyage was found in docking for a "CLASS OUTING" at Sunken Meadow State Park. At the end of June the ship docked and certificates of merit were handed out to the crew. With fond memories, sighs of farewell, and mutterances of remorse and joy - the CREW OF THE S.S. CLASS OF '61 departed into retirement.
