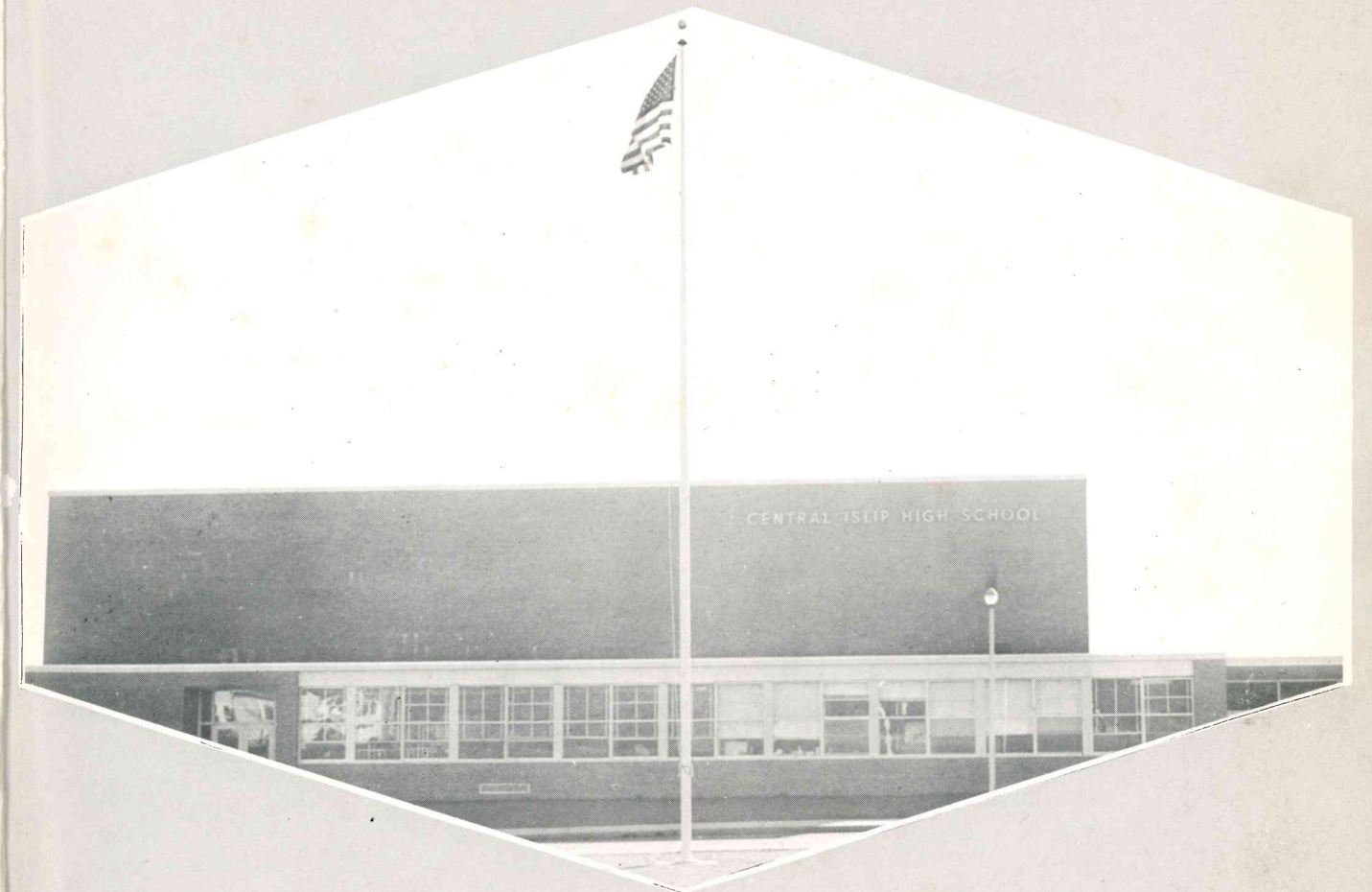

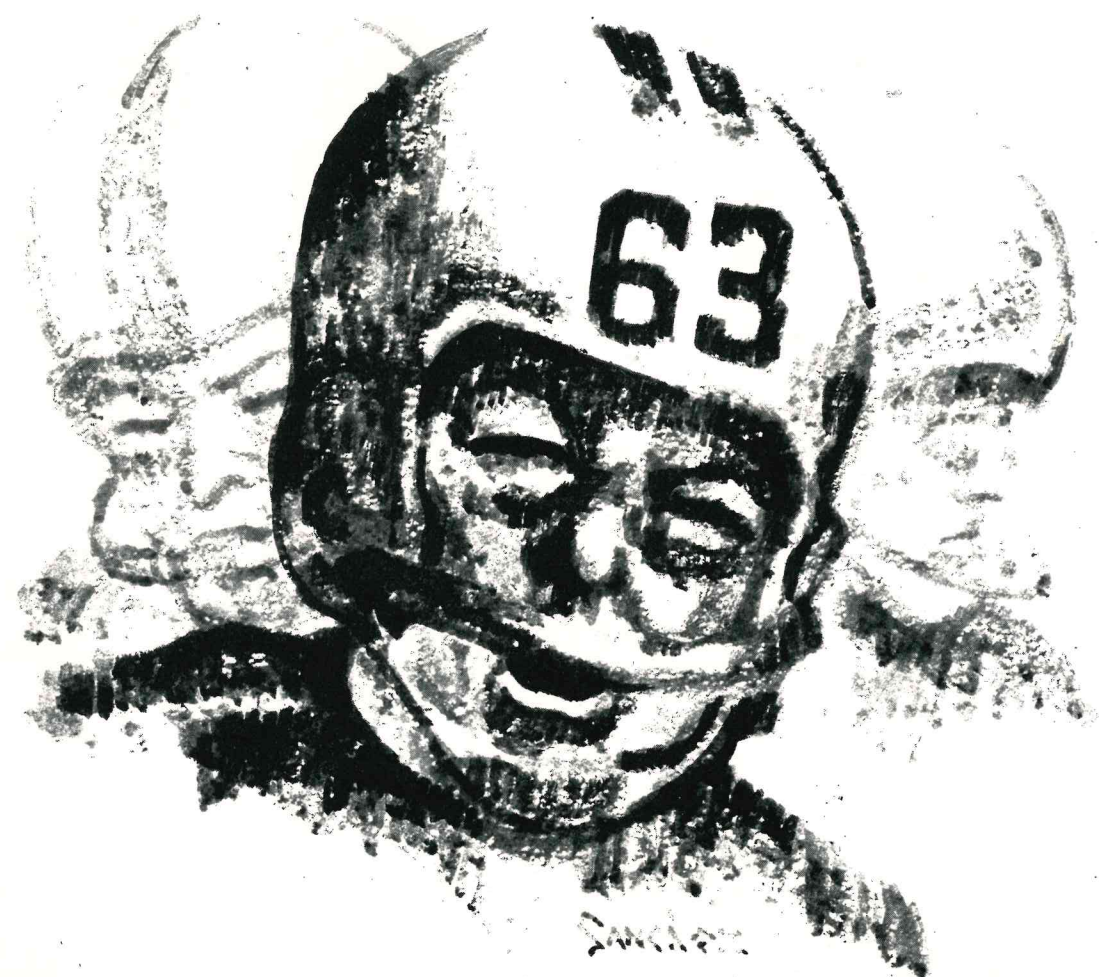

May we, the CLASS of 1963, formally say "Welcome, Dr. Phelan" to the Second Supervisory District of Suffolk County as its district superintendent.

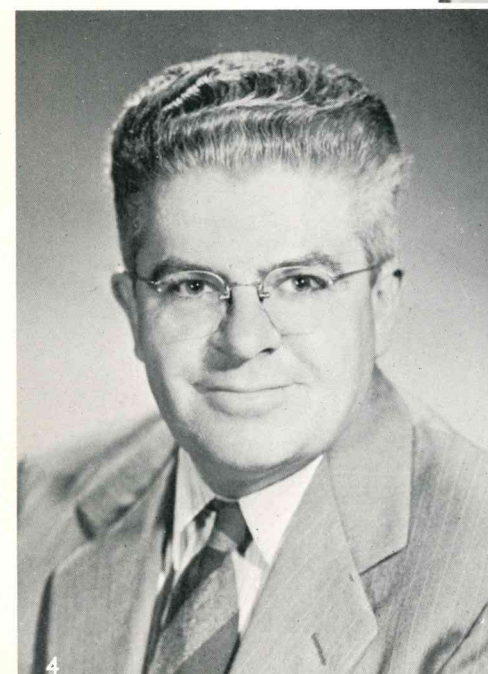

There was no doubt that this year's football team was the best ever in Central Islip's history. Mr. Goldstein's Gridders swept through the season undefeated—8 wins —0 losses—capturing the League AA II Championship. In doing this, the team was able to roll up some impressive statistics, scoring a total of 278 points, offensively, and yielding only 13 points defensively. Both of these feats were the best in Suffolk, proving that Central Islip was the top offensive and defensive team in the county.

The team swept through its first five games unscored upon, rolling over Commack 47-0, Copiague 14-0, Smithtown 39-0, Patchogue 19-0 and Bay Shore 48-0. This was Bay Shore's first loss and its worst loss in forty-five years of football.

The sixth game against Sachem brought the first points scored against the Musketeer Defense. The final score was 51-6. The next game was the biggest one of the year, bringing together two undefeated teams—West Babylon and C.I. (the winner to go on and win the league championship). In one of the hardest fought games ever played by C.I., our much smaller team came out victorious by a score of 25-7. C.I. clinched the championship with a 52-0 victory over Newfield.

Special honors, after the season, were given to Coach Dave Goldstein, voted Coach of the Year; Senior backs, Bob Scott, All-Suffolk and Pat Beck All-League; Linemen Junior Rich. Specht, All-Suffolk, and Senior John DiClemente, All-Long Island. Special praise was accorded Senior Tim Radley, by Head Coach Dave Goldstein, Offensive Coach Phil Williams, and Defensive Coach John Abbenante, for the fine job done as team quarterback.

Soccer



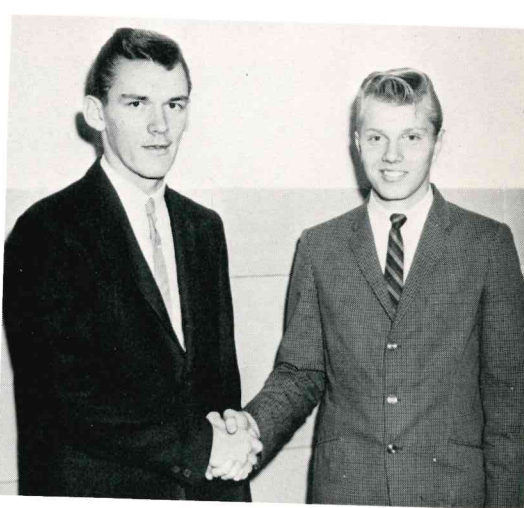

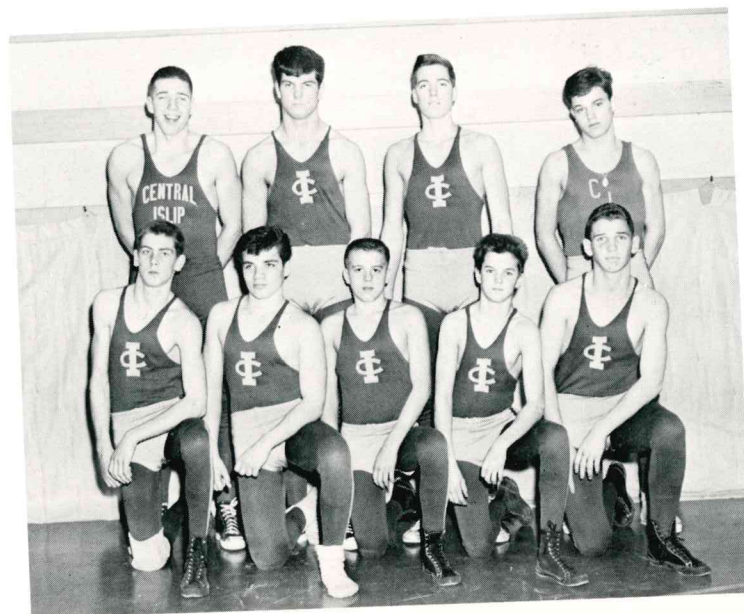


Wrestling

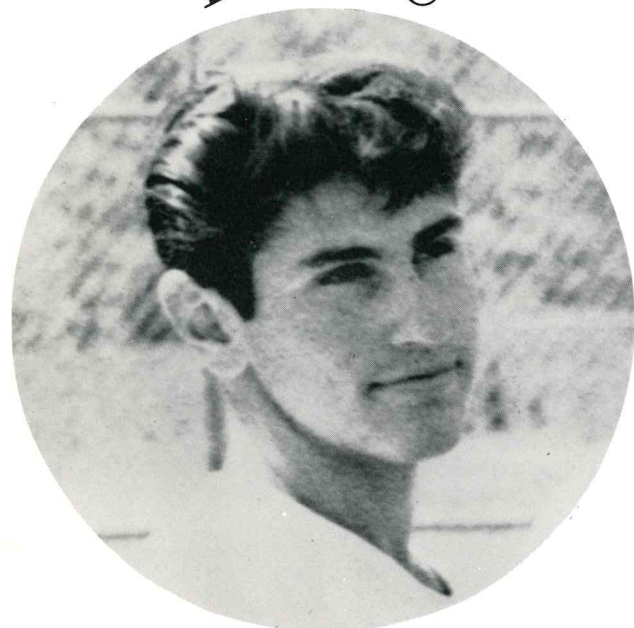

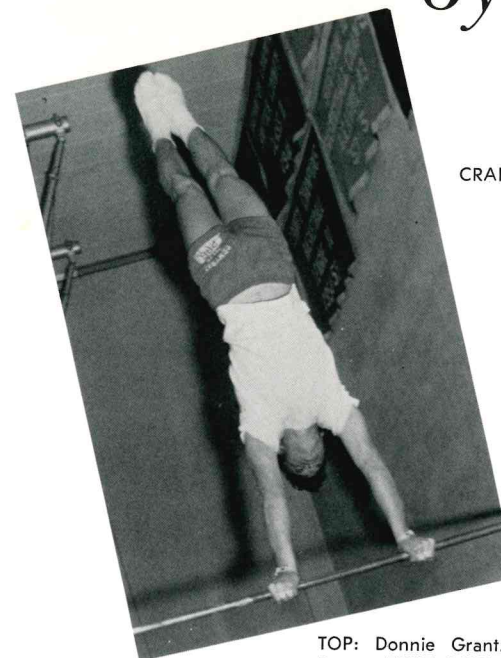
This was the first year that Central Islip had a bowling team. Our bowlers did very well for their first year finishing up the season in fourth place.

Richard Casazza ended up with high average for the team and also rolled a 243 in the County Tournament.

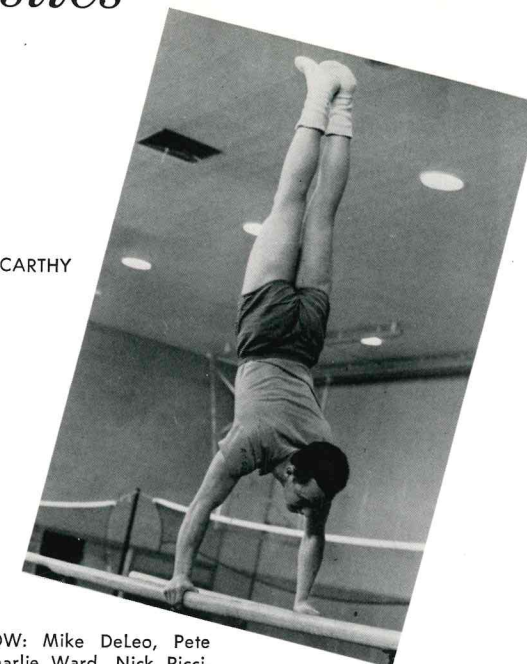

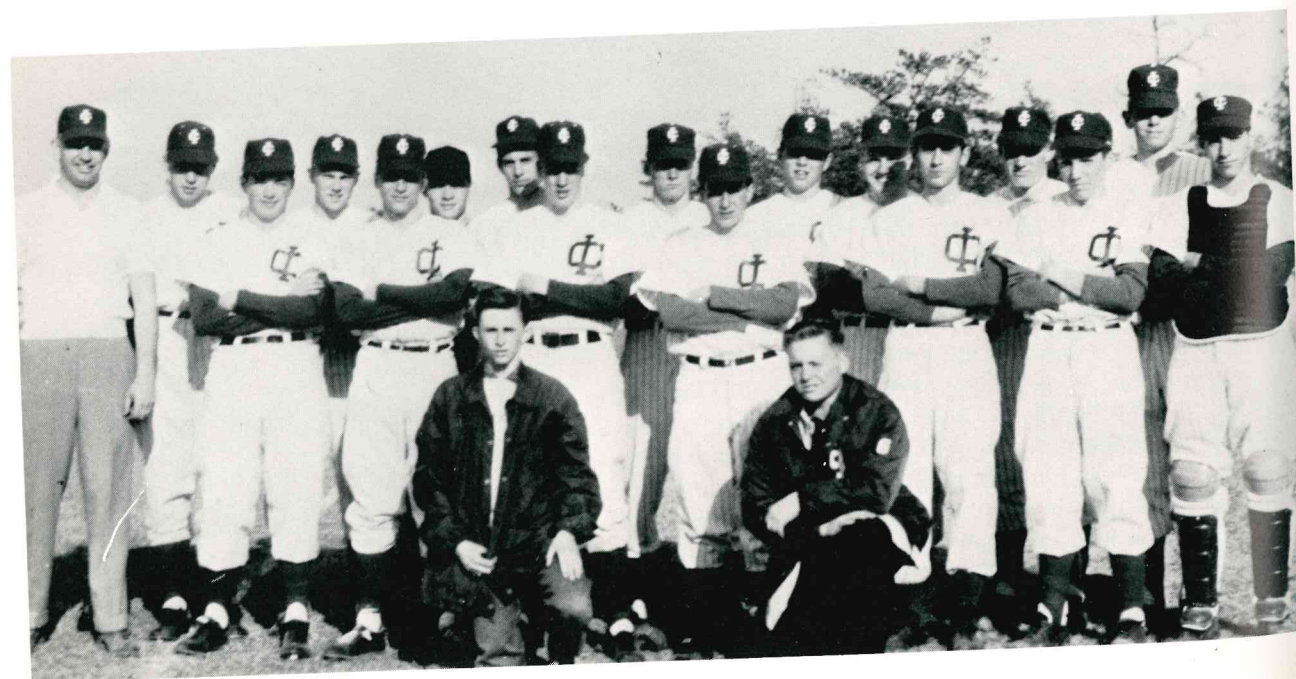


Baseball

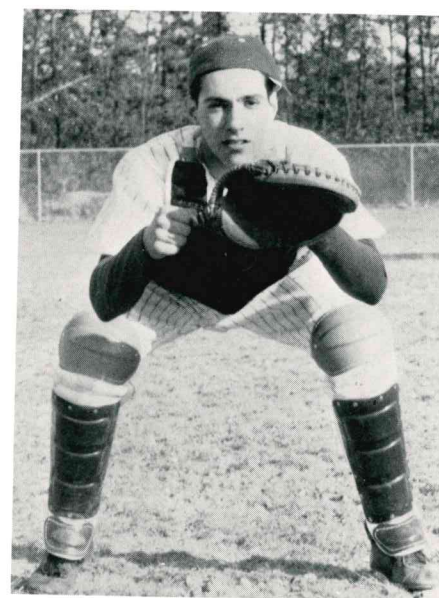

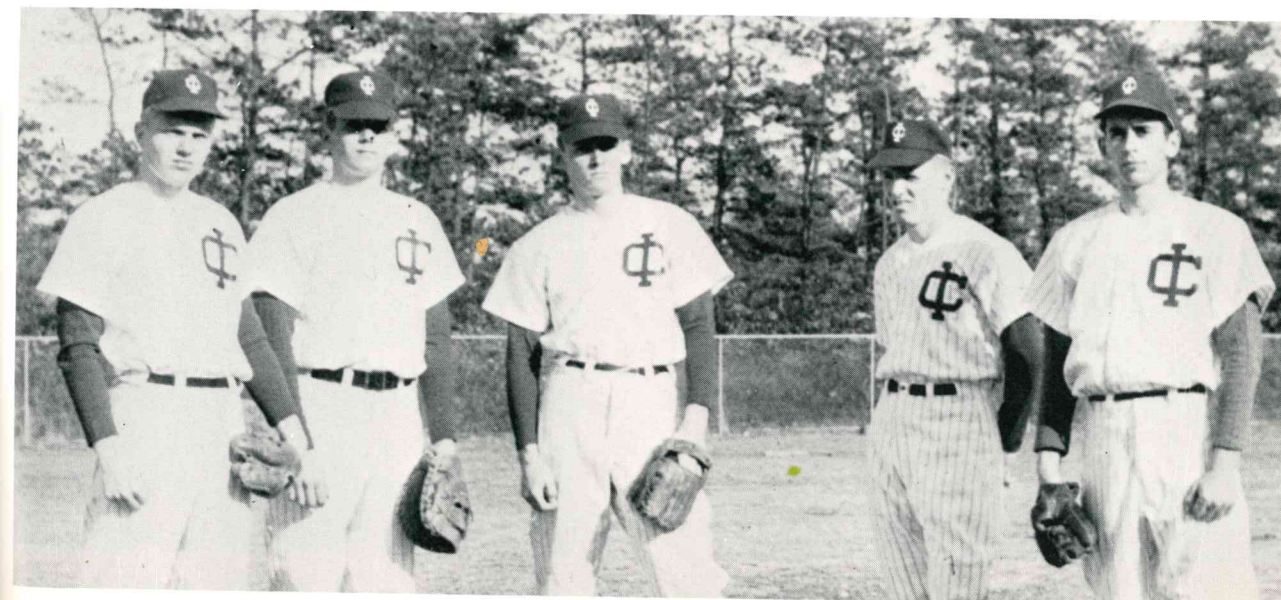

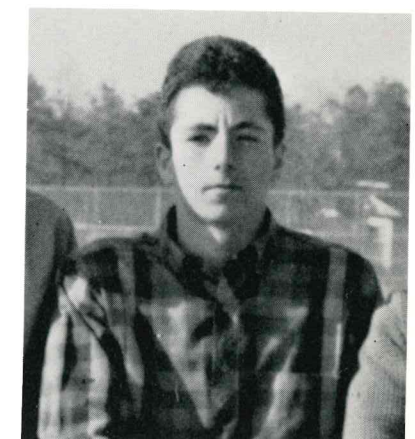
Golf
