


Wrestling

Our hope for the future lies with these boys and the hope that the school will support them.







Bowling




RICH CASAZZA—High Average

I, as a coach, am looking forward to a successful season next year because of the terrific amount of interest shown in the sport this year, and the number of new-comers who plan to come out next season.




Baseball






