Our 1963 team was built around Ed McClusky's right arm and included Bill Ringenbach, Don Harkins, and Richie Flynn, all seniors.

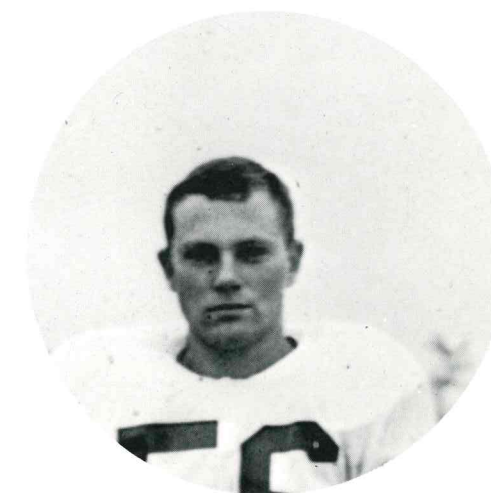

Tom Black and George O'Leary made All-County, Rich Specht was chosen All-County and All-Long Island.

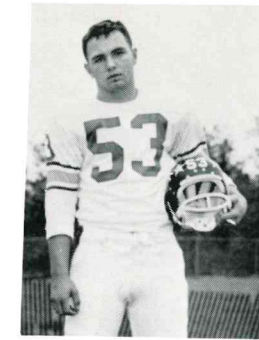

Our Basketball team for 1964 stood undefeated this year at the end of league play. Central Islip clinched the League A-I Title.

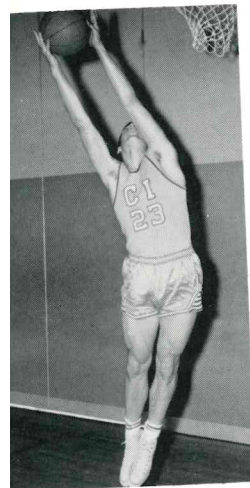

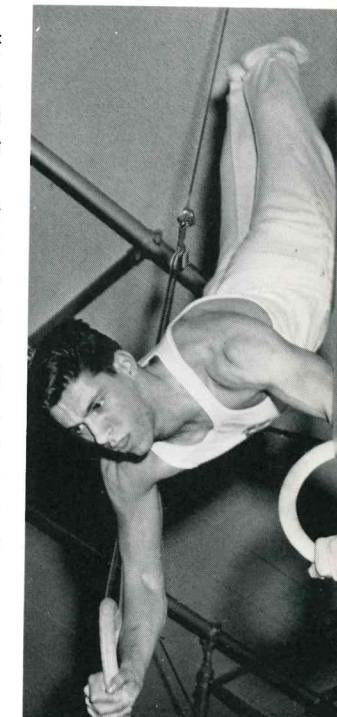
Our Junior High School boys also had a very good season which will carry over to the Varsity next year.

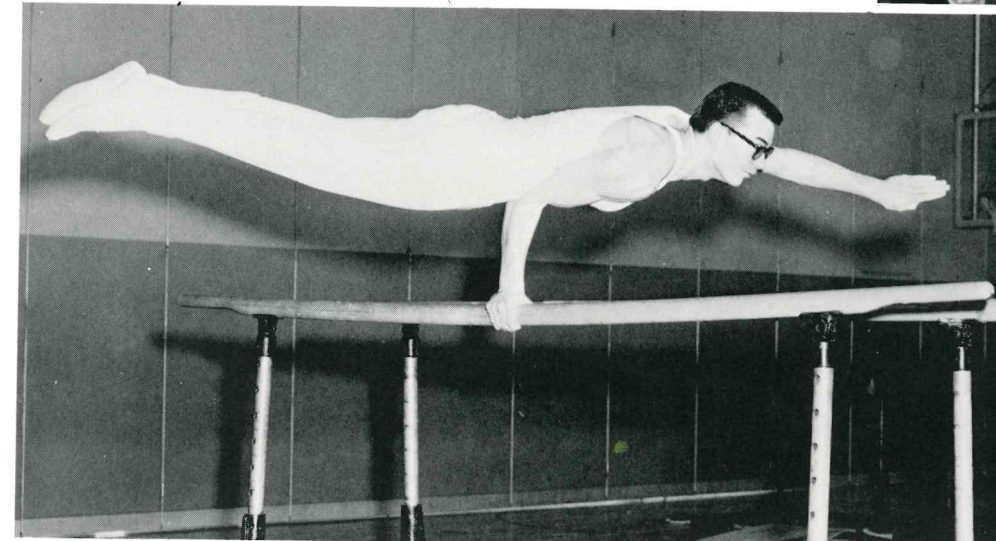
However this loss will somewhat be replaced with such hopefuls as John Lopez, Rick Friedman, Harry Greenwood, and many of the other boys on our team.

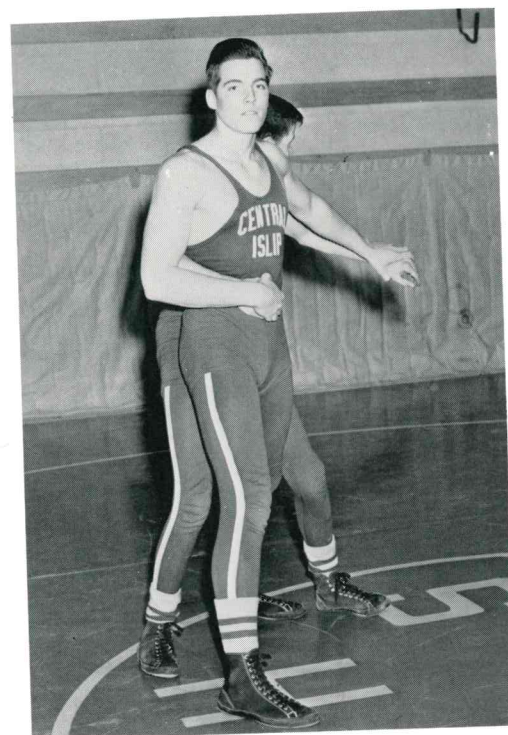
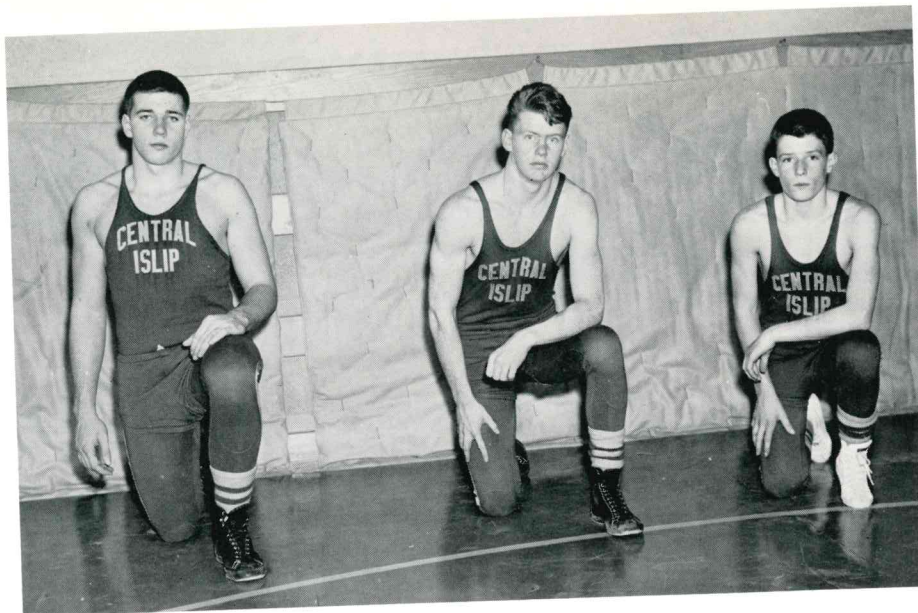

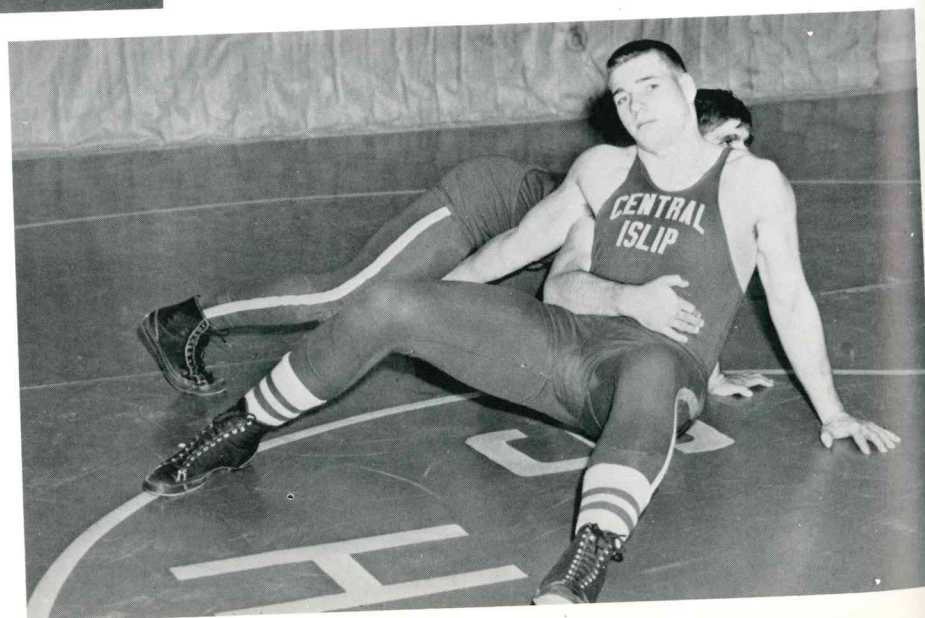
Wrestling
